This summer, 200 campers attended, with both high school age and younger kids taking part. Workers came from several locations to help out. Campers enjoyed the games, food, music, and Bible messages. As usual, churches from throughout the area brought campers. Scores of young people through the years say they came to faith in Christ at the conference.
